
# 1 Cisco VPN Client Initial Setup

### 1.1 Installation

- **1.** Double click on *Cisco VPN Client* exe installation file or unzip the setup file that can be obtained from the IGS Service Desk on 1300 764 495.
- 2. Select **English** and click **OK** (as shown below):




3. Click **Next** to continue the installation process:






### 4. Choose I accept the license agreement and click on Next to continue




5. Click **Next** to continue the installation:






6. Click **Finish** to finalise the installation:




7. You must restart the PC/Laptop in order to take complete the installation. After ensuring you other applications have been closed, click on **Yes** to restart:






## 1.2 Import the provided VPN profile

- 1. Open the client by double-click on *Cisco VPN Client* shortcut.
- 2. Click on Connection Entries:



**1.** Click **Import...** and select the provided VPN profile (**pcf** file). The example below shows TEST.pcf; the one provided to you will probably have a different name



2. After selecting the actual pcf file, click **Open** to import it



**3.** Once the file has been imported click on **OK** to continue:







### 2 Automatic Connection

# **2.1 Configure Automatic Connection**

- 1. If not already, then start the Cisco VPN Client
- 2. Click **Options** on the Cisco VPN Client top menu and select **Preferences**



3. Pick the options below and click **OK** 






### 2.2 Activate the Automatic Connection

In order to start the VPN Client automatically when Windows starts, the *Cisco VPN Client* shortcut icon should be placed within the *Windows Startup* folder.

- 1. Drag the *Cisco VPN Client* shortcut from the Desktop and place it in the *Startup* folder
- 2. Click Start > All programs > Startup





3. Reboot the pc and verify after that VPN Client is connected automatically
